### W-League Coaches Comment



The women's first team has come off three wins in all competitions to face a strong test this Saturday, as we host Palmerston North Marist at Karori Park. Both teams have won two from three matches in the W-League so far.

Marist have dealt out two thumpings in the early stages of the W-League: 6-1 against Seatoun on match-day 1 and 7-0 against Wests on match-day 2. This sends a clear message that the Wharfies will have to be defensively very solid, organised, and disciplined to keep a clean sheet.

This is a crucial match for the women's team and should provide a good barometer for where we sit in the W-League compared with our rivals. We're expecting Marist to make us work harder than ever. We welcome them to Karori Park, we will rise to the challenge, and we look forward to an excellent match.
